Tactile Feedback	Materials like honed limestone floors and microcement walls offer natural texture.	Provides a sensory experience that synthetic materials cannot replicate, enhancing comfort.

Dry Zones	Dry zones with seating areas like chairs or small lounges are being incorporated into layouts.	To create spaces for relaxation, such as reading or resting, turning the bathroom into a true retreat.
Mindset Shift	Bathrooms are no longer seen as mere functional spaces but as destinations for relaxation and rejuvenation.	To align with the growing focus on wellness in home design.
