Upgrade Tip 1: Create A Sitting Nook In The Garden

Category	Description	Tips / Resources
Step 1: Choose the Location	Select a sunny spot with six hours of sunlight daily. Consider fencing, garden paths, or larger spaces for preferred designs. Ensure the soil is well-drained and not exposed to heavy winds.	If drainage is an issue, consider a raised garden bed for better results.
Step 2: Select Native Plants and Flowers	Native plants are suited to local climate and pollinator needs. Pick blooms with varied flowering times and diverse shapes, sizes, and colors.
