Area Rugs Placement, Sizing, Care and Maintenance

Aspect	Key Points
Proper Placement	Anchors furniture, complements room layout, adjusts for traffic flow.
Size Consideration	Choose rugs proportional to room dimensions, allow sufficient floor space to frame the rug, accommodate furniture placement for balance and functionality.
Safety Considerations	Use non-slip pads, maintain flat edges, prioritize low-pile rugs in high-traffic areas.
Care Guidelines	Vacuum regularly, spot-clean gently, rotate for even wear, consult professionals for delicate rugs.
Maintenance Practices	Address spills immediately, clean floors surrounding rugs, inspect regularly for wear.
Additional Considerations	Avoid moisture accumulation, ensure compatibility with radiant heating, account for seasonal care.
