Container Design Tip 1: Deck and Patio Containers



Category	Description	Key Plants	Tips & Techniques
Deck and Patio Perennials	Transform deck and patio areas with showy, long-blooming flowers. The focus is on continuous seasonal color and mixing resilient annuals suited for sun and container life.	Geraniums, petunias, calibrachoa, lantana, angelonia, gomphrena.	Use heat-loving plants for large pots, combining height, fullness, and trailing color. Apply the design formula of one upright thriller, one mounding filler, and one trailing spiller for balance.
Affordable Elegance	Achieve sophisticated displays affordably by selecting plants that thrive and create lush arrangements.	Bright geraniums, calibrachoa, sweet alyssum.	Combine plants like geraniums with calibrachoa and alyssum to create visually stunning arrangements that soften hardscape edges.

Container Design Tip 2: Welcoming Entryway Displays



Category	Description	Key Plants	Tips & Techniques
Welcoming Entryway Displays	Your front door is the first impression your home makes, and an inviting container garden sets a nurturing and cheerful tone for visitors. Entryway containers should look welcoming and remain attractive despite daily foot traffic.	Lobelia, pansies, nemesia, dianthus, dwarf marigolds	Choose compact, tidy bloomers for a neat appearance. Pair pansies with dusty miller and trailing alyssum, or blend dianthus with dwarf marigolds and a small spiller like bacopa. Use lobelia for its delicate blossoms, which soften planter edges.

Container Design Tip 3: **Window and Rail Box Wonders**



Category	Description	Key Plants	Tip & Techniques
Window and Rail Box Wonders	Window and rail boxes bring your garden closer to your living space, creating a transition between indoors and outdoors. These planters are elevated and suitable for compact or trailing plants to enhance their aesthetic.	Petunias, Calibrachoa, Lobelia, Sweet Alyssum, Pansies, Nemesia	Use trailing plant varieties to soften box edges for a cascading effect. Mix petunias, calibrachoa, and sweet alyssum for vibrant displays with continuous blooms.

Container Design Tip 4: **Xeriscape Container Choices**



Category	Description	Key Plants	Tips & Techniques
Xeriscape Container Choices	If you live in a hot climate or want to reduce water usage without sacrificing aesthetics, xeriscape container gardens are eco-friendly and innovative.	Lantana, gomphrena, angelonia, snapdragons, Mexican floss flower (ageratum)	Create colorful combinations using lantana, gomphrena, and silvery foliage plants to reflect sunlight and conserve moisture.
	These gardens feature drought-tolerant displays for heat-prone environments.		For cooler seasons, blend snapdragons with dusty miller and calibrachoa for a unique look that respects natural resources.

Container Design Tip 5: Poolside Plantings



Category	Description	Key Plants	Tip & Techniques
Poolside Plantings	Decorating around a swimming pool requires a thoughtful approach, as the plants must endure a unique microclimate filled with intense heat, reflected sunlight, and the occasional splash of chlorinated water.	Geraniums, lantana, angelonia, petunias, calibrachoa	Use taller planters to frame spaces and elevate plants away from splashing. Pair upright plants like angelonia with mounding petunias and trailing sweet alyssum for a resort-like oasis.

Container Design Tip 6: Simple Design Rule for Container Arrangements



Design Element	Description	Plant Examples	Placement Advice
Thriller	Upright statement plants that add height and drama, serving as the focal point of the arrangement.	Ornamental grasses, spiky dracaenas, bold hibiscus	Place these plants at the center or back of the container to create structure and draw the eye upward.
Filler	Medium-height plants that fill out the arrangement, adding texture and bridging the space between thriller and spiller plants.	Colorful petunias, marigolds, coleus	Position these plants around the thriller to form a cohesive middle layer in the design.
Spiller	Trailing plants that cascade over the edges of the container, softening boundaries and adding a flowing effect.	Trailing sweet alyssum, ivy, creeping jenny	Place these plants along the outer edges of the container to enhance the lush, cascading effect.
