



Key Elements of an Inviting Entryway

Lighting Type	Purpose	Examples	Suggestions
Ambient Lighting	Provides general illumination for a welcoming atmosphere.	Chandeliers, flush-mounted lights, recessed lighting.	- Install a statement chandelier or pendant light. - Complement fixtures to your home's architectural style. - Use dramatic fixtures for high ceilings to draw attention.
Task Lighting	Offers focused illumination for specific activities.	Table lamps, wall sconces, adjustable lights.	- Use wall sconces positioned at eye level (60-66 inches from the floor). - Add subtle architectural interest to the space.
Accent Lighting	Highlights decorative or architectural features.	Picture lights, LED strips, spotlights.	- Install LED strip lights under floating shelves. - Use picture lights above artwork. - Place small table lamps on consoles for localized lighting.
Other Lighting Options	Adds convenience, efficiency, or decorative flair.
