Jack-O'-Lanterns And Vintage-Style Signs	Smiling jack-o'-lanterns paired with vintage-style "Trick or Treat" signs finish the nostalgic display. Friendly, cheerful carved expressions maintain the warm tone, while playful signage adds character.	Carve jack-o'-lanterns with wide grins and classic triangle eyes. 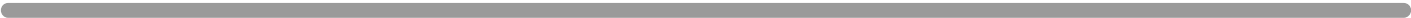

Halloween Design Tip 5: **Witch’s Apothecary**



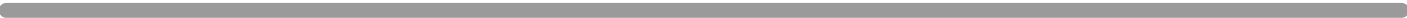
