Table 2: **Cleaning Methods**

Blind or Shade Type	Safe Cleaning Method	What to Avoid	Recommended Frequency
Real Wood Blinds	Dry microfiber dusting; furniture polish applied to a cloth for conditioning	Water submersion or heavy dampness, which causes warping	Weekly dusting; deep clean once a year
Faux Wood Blinds	Barely damp cloth with mild soap for spot cleaning	Excess moisture and harsh chemical cleaners	Weekly dusting; deep clean twice a year
Vinyl and Metal Blinds	Warm soapy water wipe-down; bathtub soak with vinegar for heavy buildup	Leaving metal wet, which can cause rust	Weekly dusting; deep clean once or twice a year
Vertical Blinds	Vacuum or brush downward only	Upward strokes, which dislodge slats	Weekly dusting; deep clean once a year
Roller and Fabric Shades	Vacuum with upholstery attachment; spot clean stains gently	Rolling up while damp; rubbing at stains	Monthly dusting; spot clean as needed
