

Home Alone: The Indoor Dog Setup Guide for Long Days



Key Consideration	Description	Examples / Recommendations
Understanding Your Dog's Needs	Dogs' behavior when left alone varies by age, temperament, breed, and routine. Separation anxiety affects 14-20% of dogs. Adult dogs should not be left alone for over four to six hours, while puppies have shorter thresholds measured by their age.	Identify if your dog is high-energy, younger, or older and calm. Tailor strategies accordingly to create a secure and engaging environment.
Interactive and Puzzle Toys	Mental stimulation reduces boredom and anxiety. Chew toys can release calming endorphins, while puzzle feeders engage dogs in problem-solving activities.	Durable chew toys made of natural rubber or nylon, rotating toy selection for novelty, and puzzle feeders or treat-dispensing devices are ideal.
Automatic Feeders and Water Systems	Consistency in mealtimes and access to fresh water helps reduce anxiety. Automatic feeders ensure timely meals, and water fountains improve hydration.	Consider options like Enabot Rola Smart Pet Water Fountain (\$60) or Petkit models for dynamic water systems.
Smart Doggie Doors	Provides dogs access to a secured outdoor space for breaks and enrichment. Uses microchip or RFID collar technology for safety.	SureFlap Microchip Pet Door Connect (\$221), Pawport Smart Pet Door (\$849). Ensure secured fencing for safety before use.
Comfortable Resting Spaces	Defined resting areas give dogs a sense of security. Quality bedding improves joint support, airflow, and temperature regulation.	Orthopedic memory foam beds, elevated bedding, and crates with positive reinforcement training are beneficial.
Calming Aids and Environmental Enrichment	Reduces sound sensitivities and creates a soothing atmosphere with calming music, white noise, or pheromone diffusers.	Use DAP diffusers, YouTube relaxation music (e.g., Relax My Dog), and products like the ThunderShirt anxiety wrap.
Indoor Monitoring Systems	Monitors dog activity remotely, with some allowing interaction or intervention as needed. Emergency preparedness is also essential.	Petcube Bites 2 Lite (\$70) or Furbo 360° Dog Camera for advanced tracking. Ensure a trusted neighbor holds a spare key.
Building a Routine	A consistent approach with regular meals, exercise, training, and gradual adaptation strengthens your dog's self-management	Focus on your dog's priority needs first—mental engagement, comfort, or calm—then build incrementally
