Protection Tip 2: Low-Cost Safety Measures



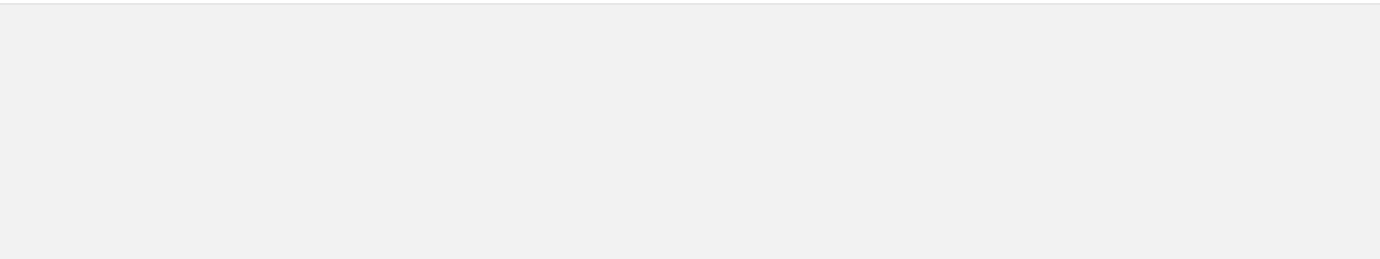

Placement in less obvious locations like utility closets adds another layer of protection.
Fireproof and Waterproof Containers	Protecting paper documents from fire and water damage is crucial, and specialized containers provide a cost-effective solution to secure essential records.	Using fireproof and waterproof document bags to store passports, birth certificates, and wills ensures protection. Digital backups via encrypted USB drives or secure cloud storage add another safety net.
Unconventional Hiding Locations	Placing important documents or valuables in unpredictable spots discourages thieves who search typical locations.	Hiding items under furniture, in board game boxes, hollowed-out books, or unused clothing creates secure solutions. Everyday objects like food containers or feminine hygiene boxes can covertly store valuables.
Basic Locks and Safeguards	Even simple locking mechanisms for shared spaces can create a sense of security and privacy while preventing unauthorized access.	Lockable file cabinets, desk drawers, or the use of combination locks on storage bins and toolboxes act as deterrents and add a physical barrier to protect belongings.

Firewalls and Network Security	Your home network is the gateway to connected devices. Securing it with firewall settings and strong Wi-Fi encryption helps block malicious traffic.	Enable WPA3 or strong WPA2 encryption, change default router credentials, and set up a guest network for better security.
Software Updates and Antivirus	Regular updates patch vulnerabilities in software, reducing risks. Antivirus programs protect devices by detecting and blocking malware and viruses.	Turn on updates for all devices and install a reliable antivirus program to maintain strong defenses against threats.
Data Backup and Encryption	Backing up files ensures data recovery in case of loss. Encrypting sensitive data adds a layer of protection, especially for devices prone to theft.	Follow the 3-2-1 backup rule and use full-disk encryption for laptops and USB drives with personal or financial information.
VPNs and Safe Browsing	VPNs secure your internet connection on public networks by encrypting data, while safe browsing habits prevent exposure to phishing attacks and malware.	Use a trusted VPN and practice caution with emails, links, and attachments to ensure secure internet usage.
